

HOUSE REPUBLICAN STUDY COMMITTEE’S BUDGET
Budget to cut Social Security by adopting the chained CPI, Cut Medicare

The House Republican Study Committee’s budget, offered by Rep. Woodall (R-GA), would have cut Social Security benefits by switching to the chained CPI and increasing the normal retirement age to 70. It also would have ended Medicare as we know it by moving it to a premium-support (voucher) program. This budget failed on March 20th (Roll Call, No. 86) with 104 votes in favor, 132 votes against, and 171 votes “present.” No Democrats voted for it. The chart below notes the 104 Republicans who voted in favor of this budget:
